- It can be used to **demonstrate** relevance and value.




# Introduction to the Strategic Framework for Heritage Science in the UK

- The pathways are a prompt for today's group discussion sessions
- Each pathway includes:
  - Stakeholder groups from which collaborators may come
  - Action areas from the [Strategic Framework for Heritage Science in the UK](#)
  - Results (intermediate outcomes) that come together to generate the overall outcome
- Each pathway is missing information on specific activity (outputs) for the action areas


# Research pathway – action areas to outcome

Key assumption: Better research structures and collaboration lead to higher quality outputs and innovation




# Public value pathway – action areas to outcome

Key assumption: By systematically measuring and demonstrating value, we can increase recognition and support for heritage science



# Community pathway – action areas to outcome

Key assumption: Building skills and inclusion creates a stronger, more sustainable community
