- Exhibitor tables will be located in UCL's Engineering Front Building, Malet Place, WC1E 7JE, where the poster show will be held and refreshments will be served.
- Refreshment sessions take place at registration, morning break and lunch time.
- Attendees will also be able to access the area during the day if they choose not to attend programme sessions. Conference capacity is 100 attendees.
- The main conference sessions will be held upstairs from the exhibitor/poster/refreshment space.
- The afternoon workshops are held in separate rooms at another location on the Bloomsbury campus with capacity of 30-60 people.
- Exhibitors are asked to bring all materials with them on the day and clear all materials away at the end of the day.
- The exhibition space is not secure and although it will be discouraged during the conference, exhibitors should be aware that the space is accessible to students/staff at UCL and the public.
